Participants must complete an on-line exam prior to the in-person component. The workshop utilizes simulation based education and debriefing to support team-based approach to care.

Individuals providing newborn care such as licensed or regulated health professionals (or students) such as physicians, nurses, midwifes, respiratory therapists or paramedics.
