Choosing Wisely Online Course

Interprofessional Online Learning | University of Saskatchewan

<u>Course Overview:</u> The course will focus on Choosing Wisely Canada elements, as they relate to in-hospital care and where appropriate, elements of preoperative care, diagnostic imaging and lab tests, as well as appropriate medications. Models of care that are linked to superior and safer patient outcomes.

<u>Target Audience:</u> This course is suitable for family physicians, specialist physicians, nurses, residents, students, pharmacists, diagnostic imaging, laboratory medicine, and other health care professionals.

Course Learning Objectives: Upon completion of this course, the learner will be able to:

- recognize the limitations of various clinical investigations and apply this understanding to provide high-value care;
- identify the importance of communication with the lab specialist and the positive value this communication/collaboration has
 in terms of tailoring patient care, limiting needless testing and exposure to risk that is otherwise unnecessary;
- identify the costs of investigation and treatments (lab, radiologic, antibiotic or otherwise) that are involved in the care of their patients and apply this knowledge to the appropriate investigations in future; and
- select investigations for the patient's condition that integrate current evidence to reduce unnecessary risks to patient safety.
