The ACoRN Workshop provides health care professionals with the knowledge and skills of neonatal resuscitation, assessment and management of the at-risk newborn. Participants must complete an on-line exam prior to the in-person component. The workshop utilizes simulation based education and debriefing to support team-based approach to care.

### Who can take ACoRN?

Individuals providing newborn care such as licensed or regulated health professionals (or students) such as physicians, nurses, midwives, respiratory therapists or paramedics.
